Rotarian Action Groups conduct hands-on, international service projects that advance the Object of Rotary. They're organized by committed Rotarians, family and friends, who have expertise and a passion for a particular type of service.



Each Rotarian Action Group is officially recognized by the RI Board of Directors, but functions independently of Rotary International, with its own rules, dues requirements, and administrative structure.

Each group maintains at least 100 members representing at least 10 countries and three Rotary zones and must adopt Rotary policies.

Rotarian Action Groups provide opportunities for Rotarians to engage in partnership with like-minded Rotarians outside of their own club, district, or country. The Action Group benefits from the expertise and collaboration of Rotarians from all over the world. All projects have the potential to significantly enhance Rotary's public image.

"Service above Self". The Rotary motto reminds us to think of how we can help others instead of just helping ourselves. The motto originated when Paul Harris asked a Rotarian to address the second annual Rotary Convention in 1911. Frank Collins, a fruit merchant from Minneapolis told how his club had used the phrase "Service, Not Self" as a motto and that it was fundamental to them as to what it meant to be a Rotarian. The speech and the motto struck a cord with all the Rotarians. It neatly sum up in three words what Rotary, at its core, was all about.

Over time the motto evolved to "Service Above Self". At the 1950 Rotary Convention, the motto was officially adopted. Collins' simple idea remains as powerful today as it was over 100 years ago. Rotarians find inspiration and connect with others through service helping to bring about international goodwill and world peace.
